

# Communion offering

---

The Communion offering on Sunday 6 July is for the Communion Fund, which is distributable at the discretion of the Minister to assist those in need.

On Sunday 3 August we will be supporting North London Hospice with the Communion offering. The hospice is a registered charity that has been caring for local people since 1984. They are committed to empowering patients with life-limiting illnesses, supporting them to achieve the best quality of life possible, and welcome people from all faiths and communities within the boroughs of Barnet, Enfield and Haringey, also offering some of their services to people within Camden and Islington. They provide physical, emotional and spiritual care to patients and families, friends and carers and their multi-professional team consists of specially trained doctors, nurses, physiotherapists, social workers, counsellors and chaplains. Their goal is to help patients live life to the full despite their illness.

As well as their Inpatient Unit at Woodside Avenue (N12), they also work within the wider community to improve people's quality of life. They also have Outpatient and Wellbeing services, provide support in patients' homes, and have Community Palliative Care Teams. Their Specialist Palliative Care Services are provided free of charge. They receive some government funding, but on the whole rely on donations and legacies to meet the cost of providing their services.

A collection plate will be at the back of the church after each service, and any donations would be gratefully received.



# **The Miraculous Draught of Fishes and Christ's Charge to Peter**

---

Rafaello Santi (or Sanzio), known as Raphael, Michelangelo and Leonardo da Vinci were the three greatest artists of the Italian High Renaissance. Raphael was also a draughtsman, architect and archaeologist. He was born in 1483 in Urbino in the Italian Marches, where his father was a court painter. After working with Perugino in Perugia in Umbria, he moved to Florence. From 1508 he was in Rome where, with assistants, he painted frescoes on the walls and ceilings of rooms in the Papal Apartments, between 1509 and 1514. He was much in demand for church altarpieces of the Virgin and Child and for portraits, which included that of his patron Pope Julius II. He also painted various other frescoes and designs for tapestries. In 1514 he was appointed architect for St Peter's Basilica in Rome and remained in the city until his death in 1520.

One of the most demanding commissions that Raphael received was to design ten monumental tapestries on the lives of Saints Peter and Paul. These were woven in 1516 in Brussels and hung on the walls of the Sistine Chapel in the Papal Palace in Rome. Seven of the 10 cartoons (as the designs were known) have survived. They were painted in body colour (watercolour with white added to make it opaque) on to paper which was later mounted on canvas.

John's Gospel records how, after his resurrection, Jesus appeared to some of his disciples at Lake Tiberius (Sea of Galilee). They had been on the lake but had not caught any fish until Jesus appeared and told

them to try again. This time they caught many fish (John 21:6).

In Raphael's painting and the tapestry disciples are leaning over the side of the boat to pull up the net full with fish while birds are standing on the shore looking hopefully for fish to eat. At the side Peter is kneeling in front of Jesus with his hands clasped together.

In Christ's Charge to Peter which follows, Jesus asks Peter three times whether he loves him and tells Peter to care for his sheep (John 21:15-17).

In the painting and the tapestry Jesus is standing in front of a group of his disciples and pointing at Peter who is kneeling in front of him. With his other hand Jesus is pointing towards a flock of sheep.

The cartoons of the lives of Peter and Paul may be seen in the Victoria and Albert Museum in South Kensington in London. The tapestries are in the Vatican Museum in Rome.
